


**GOING OUT (05)**  
**At a sporting event (02) - How to cheer (3)**

**In context:**

**What are they doing?**

John and Pam are at an American football game. They are rooting for their team!

**Language tip:**

Exclamation points (!) are used to show excitement. When we cheer, we are excited and usually shouting. Therefore, exclamation points are used with all cheering phrases.
