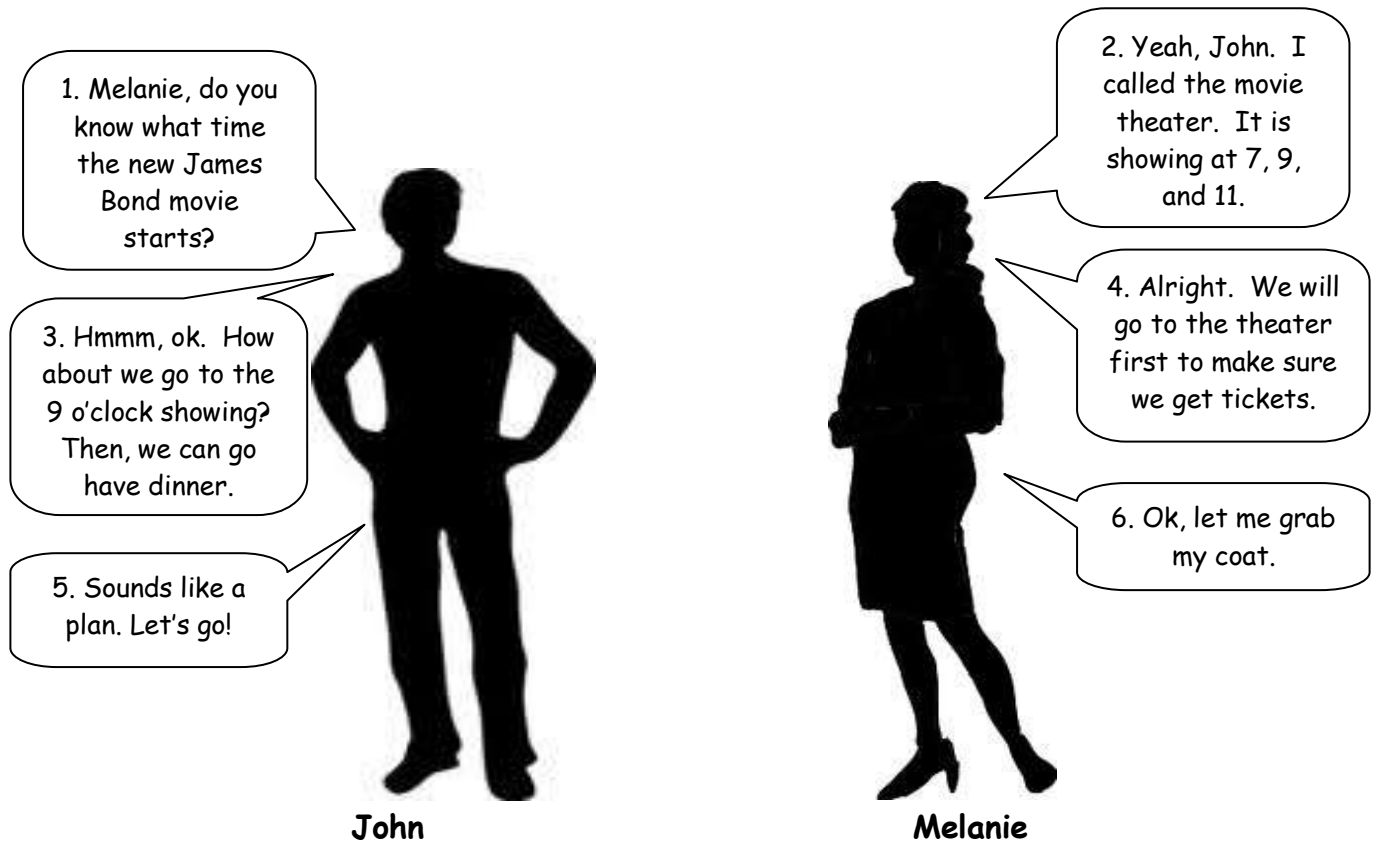


**GOING OUT (05)**  
**At the movies (04) - Asking about movie times (1)**

**In context:**  
**3-5 minutes**



**What are they doing?**

John and Melanie are talking about what time they want to see a movie.

**Vocabulary:**

**Language tip**  
**1-2 minutes**

In American English, the place to watch movies is called the "theater." It is spelled with the "e" before the "r."

In other countries, a place to watch movies is called a "Cinema" or a "theatre." It is spelled with the "e" after the "r."

Also, sometimes we use the word "movie" and sometimes the word "film" is used, mostly outside of the United States.
