A short adjective is an adjective with one syllable or two syllables ending in -y, -ow, -le, -er.

Examples:

pretty → prettier

 $narrow \rightarrow narrower$

gentle \rightarrow gentler

clever → cleverer

If the adjective ends with a single vowel and a consonant, this consonant is doubled for superiority.

Example:

big → bigger

There are 3 important irregular adjectives:

Adjective	Comparative of Superiority	Superlative of Superiority
good	better	the best
bad	worse	the worst
far	farther / further	the farthest / the furthest

Language Tip on Irregular Comparatives and Superlatives 5 min

For 'good', 'bad', 'far', the irregular form is only for the superiority.

Example:

 $good \rightarrow better than (superiority), as good as (equality), less good than (inferiority)$
