Forming a Noun 5 min

Unfortunately, there is no simple rule that connects a noun to the adjective or verb it comes from. But they generally look similar.

Examples:

Nouns coming from a verb: to organize \rightarrow organization to change \rightarrow change to try \rightarrow trial

Nouns coming from an adjective: strong > strength stupid > stupidity intelligent > intelligence
